Contractor Guidelines for Construction Permit Extensions and Expired Construction Permits

### **EFFECTIVE OCTOBER 01, 2021**

CAFMA WILL STRICTLY ADHERE TO THE FOLLOWING 2018 IFC REQUIREMENTS RELATED TO CONSTRUCTION PERMIT EXTENSIONS AND EXPIRED CONSTRUCTION PERMITS.

#### **Permit Extensions**

Contractors may request a permit extension only for current / valid permits.

#### [A]105.3.2 Extensions.

A permittee holding an <u>unexpired permit</u> shall have the right to apply for an extension of the time within which the permittee will commence work under that permit where work is unable to be commenced within the time required by this section for good and satisfactory reasons. The *fire code official* is authorized to grant, in writing, one or more extensions of the time period of a permit for periods of not more than 180 days each. Such extensions shall be requested by the permit holder in writing and justifiable cause demonstrated.

- 1. Confirm the permit is still valid and has not expired;
- 2. Visit our website (<u>www.cazfire.org</u>) to apply for a permit extension;

- 3. Receive notification from CAFMA that your request has been approved or denied

#### **Expired Permits**

Permits become invalid (expire) 180 days after issuance if no verified work has been completed, or if there has been a lapse of 180 days since the last verified work was completed. Contractors must obtain a new permit if the permit is expired. If no changes have been made, and no changes will be made, the fee for the new permit will be one-half the amount required for a new permit. However, if changes <a href="have been made">have been made</a> or <a href="will be made to the original construction documents">will be made to the original construction documents</a>, or if the lapse in work has exceeded one year, the contractor will have to apply for a new permit at the New Submission rate.

#### [A]105.3.1 Expiration.

An operational permit shall remain in effect until reissued, renewed or revoked, or for such a period of time as specified in the permit. Construction permits shall automatically become invalid unless the work authorized by such permit is commenced within 180 days after its issuance, or if the work authorized by such permit is suspended or abandoned for a period of 180 days after the time the work is commenced. **Before such work recommences**, a new permit shall be first obtained and the fee to recommence

work, if any, shall be one-half the amount required for a new permit for such work, provided that changes have not been made and will not be made in the original construction documents for such work, and provided further that such suspension or abandonment has not exceeded one year. Permits are not transferable and any change in occupancy, operation, tenancy or ownership shall require that a new permit be issued.

- 1. Confirm the permit is no longer valid and has expired;
- 2. Submit a completed *Expired Permit Replacement* form and appropriate payment to CAFMA (see sample attached)
- 3. Receive notification from CAFMA that your permit replacement request has been approved.

[A]105.3.1 EXPIRATION.  AN OPERATIONAL PERMIT SHALL REMAIN IN EFFECT UNTIL REISSUED, RE AS SPECIFIED IN THE PERMIT.
