They each did very well throughout their training and I'm confident they will provide excellent care in the field. Job well done gentlemen!

Our next six paramedics start their training this month.

The plan for starting the transport service has been pushed back four weeks. This is a result of delays working through contracts with our outside billing agency which has taken a little longer than anticipated. It's important that when we start operations, we can bill per statute, especially with Medicare and Medicaid. We definitely don't want any billing issues with the Federal Government.

The postings for an EMS specialist as well as for the Wellness Officer close next week. We should have these processes completed and positions filled before the middle of September, if not sooner.

We are closing in on our September deadline to have our accreditation package ready for submittal. Chief Parra and Chief Lucas have done an outstanding job getting us to this point! Many of us are drafting different categories and should have those submitted in the next week or so for review.

Our second ladder, a 75' single axle, is officially on order from Pierce. The build time is two years. That said, we continue to receive monthly updates regarding demo apparatus. If one becomes available that's close to our specifications before our build starts, we'll be able to make the purchase and cancel the order.

I went to the Prescott Valley Town Council meeting Thursday evening and spoke during the public hearing for Lakeshore 650. While I did not specifically ask the council to approve the project, I did point out that the Fain Signature Group had set aside 2.5 acres for a public safety facility as part of the project. In addition, the project offers a variety of housing options along with multiple parks, a club soccer facility, and space for commercial occupancies e.g., medical, grocery, law offices, etc. The council passed all three zoning changes required for the development. This is a long-term project that won't break ground for at least two-years and will take years to complete.

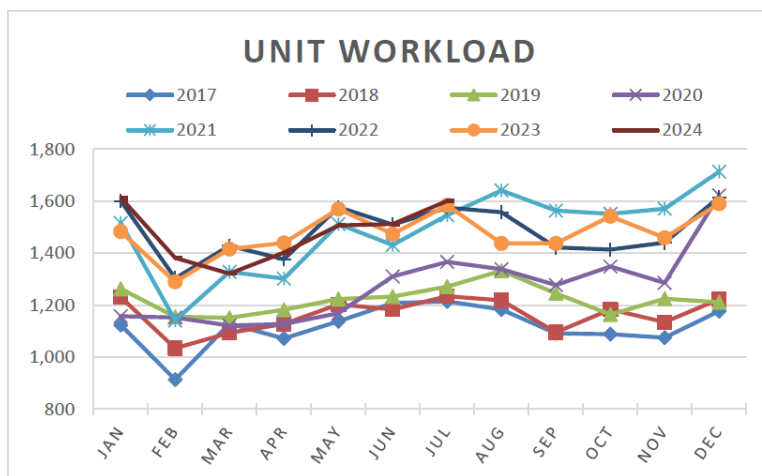
